Degree Program

The following degree program exists for those that are interested in earning a California Inland Empire Council sponsored "Degree in Scouting" Each class is worth 1 credit regardless of length.

Associate's Degree - Ideal for First year Scouters

- Currently registered and Current YPT Certificate
- Position-specific trained for your current position
- Attend University and take 3 classes

Bachelor's Degree – Ideal for newer scouters and dedicated leaders

- Must have earned the Associate's degree
- Take 2 additional classes (5 total)
- Attend 2 Roundtables

Master's Degree – Ideal for involved Scouters looking to further their involvement and leadership

- Must have earned a University of Scouting Bachelor's degree.
- Take 3 additional classes (8 total)
- Current certificates for 2 online national training classes (Hazardous weather, Safe Swim Defense, Trek Safely, climb On Safely, Safety Afloat)
- Lead one Unit Level outing, training, or meeting (virtual or In-Person)
- Earn one Adult Knot and/or commit to attending Wood Badge

<u>Doctorate's Degree</u> – Ideal for strong seasoned leaders

- Must have earned a University of Scouting Master's degree.
- Take 4 additional classes (12 total)
- Must have earned their Wood Badge beads
- Lead one additional (2 total) Unit Level outing, training, or meeting (virtual or In-Person)
- Attend a District meeting /Staff a district event or serve as a unit commissioner
